Equator University of Science and Technology (EQUSaT), in collaboration with Helping Hands for Relief and Development (HHRD), hosted a youth empowerment program on June 13, 2024.

Held at the university premises in Kasijjagirwa, Masaka City, the program attracted a large number of youth from the region. Attendees had the opportunity to learn from a distinguished panel of speakers, including Dr. Bint Juma Luwedde, a renowned psychiatrist: Solomon Mudenya, a financial literacy expert and EQUSaT bursar; and Eng. Kasagga Usama, an information technology expert and seasoned leader.

Addressing the participants, Dr. Luwedde emphasized the significance of self-reflection and deliberate decision-making.

"In mental health, engaging in self-reflection before making decisions is crucial. This is why it is advised to think before you act. It is also essential to concentrate on your



own affairs rather than becoming preoccupied with others," she advised.

Solomon Mudenya encouraged the youth to prioritize saving money over indulging in ventures that may not yield future financial benefits. He urged them to save for profitable investments to enhance their financial stability.

Eng. Usama Kasagga called on youth leaders in Masaka to reflect on their leadership approaches, emphasizing the importance of sympathy and empathy in serving the community humanely.

The university's Vice Chancellor, Prof. Mouhammad Mpezamihigo, expressed gratitude to HHRD for their collaboration with EQUSaT in making the program a reality. He pledged that such ini-

Speaking at the youth empowerment program held at EQUSaT on June 13, 2024, at the university's premises in Kasijjagirwa, Masaka City, Prof. Mpezamihigo encouraged students and staff at EQUSaT to take the lead. He proposed that students could save up to UGX 10,000 monthly, while staff could save UGX 40,000 each.

"Let's not talk about saving without action. Let there be a Student's Sacco where students can save about UGX 10,000 per month and, after about six months, sit together and decide on which business to start. And if the students can save money, what about you, the staff?" he stated.

Prof. Mpezamihigo pledged to support these Saccos once established to ensure their successful implementation
